## Positive Negative Question

Spelling rules for forming past simple of regular verbs:

SINGULAR	I walked	I didn't walk	Did I walk ?	<b>work - worked</b> <b>cry - cried</b> <b>spy - spied</b> <b>play - played</b> <b>fit - fitted</b> <b>stop - stopped</b> <b>live - lived</b> <b>dance - danced</b>
	You walked	You didn't walk	Did you walk ?	
	He walked	He didn't walk	Did he walk ?	
	She walked	She didn't walk	Did she walk ?	
	It walked	It didn't walk	Did it walk ?	
PLURAL	We walked	We didn't walk	Did we walk ?	Can you find at least one more grammar rule with the same spelling rules?  Mind the pronunciation of verbs ending in /t/ and /d/: visit - visited [vɪzɪtɪd] start - started [stɑ:tɪd] decide - decided [dɪ'saɪdɪd]
	You walked	You didn't walk	Did you walk ?
